Southpaws imaging capability is managed by specialist Dr Natalie Webster providing interpretation of ultrasound, radiographs, CT and MRI studies for referring veterinarians either remotely or on an outpatient basis. Southpaws high speed multi-slice Computed Tomography (CT) scanner is one of the newest of its type for veterinary use in Australia – its higher image quality gives faster and more accurate diagnosis of tumour location and type. When coupled with 3D printing, Southpaws surgeons can hold a model of the cancer site in their hands to more accurately guide surgery, reduce risks and aid communications.

Guaranteed Care

To complete the picture, Southpaws pride themselves on their compassionate and personalized patient care. Southpaws vets and supporting staff go to great lengths to offer detailed and compassionate discussion of treatment options and prognosis to pet owners. Southpaws in-hospital care is second to none with patients accomodated in an open plan treatment room with comfortable bedding and regular monitoring by dedicated nursing staff.
